## TOP TIPS

- ✓ Regular brushing will lift the sward and reduce disease
- ✓ Do not try and remove too much grass in one go – topping off encourages the grass to thicken out and makes for better results later into the season
- ✓ Do not roll if the conditions are wet as this could cause structural damage to the plant
- ✓ Do not neglect the outfield – a programme of solid or slit tining will assist water movement and aerate the soil

## CRICKET SQUARE CARE

A regular application product such as Angus BioActive MolTurf for the cricket square would ensure it has the correct nutrition.

## WORM ACTIVITY

If worm activity is a problem you'll now be able to use Angus Downcast, a non-pesticidal, plant nutrient based liquid that encourages casting worms away from sward surface.

## ROOT DEVELOPMENT

Consider a low nitrogen, higher potassium feed like Mini K-Recharge 5-3-20 1 Fe for root development.

## EXPERT ADVICE

The cricket square and outfield may now require nutrition. Obviously this depends on location but I often recommend a slow release fertiliser for the outfield such as Verdiculture 4-8-10.

Cricket square aeration should cease before the end of February.

Towards the end of the month, if the wickets are not wet you can start to roll with a light machine and some mowing may be required if it is mild.

If you're looking to green up the plant and control the moss growth, Angus Fine Turf Fertiliser High N +FE 9-0-0+11%FE would be a good choice.
