**ORDER FUNGICIDE**

**TOP TIPS**

- ✔ If you need to mow, use a rotary pedestrian mower rather than a cylinder mower which could tear fragile growth.
- ✔ Regular brushing to remove dew will reduce the likelihood of disease outbreak throughout the winter
- ✔ Keep an eye out for yellowing and consider a turf hardener such as Angus Robust

**MAXIMISE ROOT DEPTH**

A Fine Turf Fertiliser such as VerdiCulture with a high Iron content will help to harden turf and improve the overall health and appearance of fine turf.

**PRIORITISE DRAINAGE**

Don't let the January weather curtail the maintenance work- consider what drainage work may be required on the outfield.

**PREVENT DISEASE**

In the event of a wet and mild winter you may need to consider a fungicide containing fludioxonil like Medallian to prevent any outbreaks of disease.

**EXPERT ADVICE**

Continue the aeration programme when conditions allow. Use a solid tine aerator and try to achieve a little more depth than the previous operation to encourage a deeper root development.

In between aeration operations use a Sarrel roller to keep the square surface free draining.

To maximise root depth and growth before the wickets are cut closer consider using VerdiCulture NPK 6-5-10 +6% Fe and applications of iron and magnesium to maximise photosynthesis.

Beware of frost. Any activity on the field when frost is on the ground could cause serious damage to the grass.



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
